<p><b>Simon Schwitzer</b> 1851-1937 Grandfather</p> <p>One of 6 children, 2 older sisters (Fani &amp; Johanna), younger brother (Max) and 2 younger sisters (Berta &amp; Rosa). Well-dressed and "gentleness personified" in MKS's words. Grew up in Slovak village inn, at 16 ran away to Budapest to work as drinks waiter. Became farmer. After first wife (Amalia Schlesinger) died in childbirth with first son (Josef), married her cousin (Johanna Kuffler), farmed in Madunice, had 4 more children (Berta, Štefan, Leonka, Frieda). Later had other farms around Nitra, and apartment in Nitra. Mentioned in book on Nitra as benevolent landowner. Donated bell (cast 1928) for Nitra's Piarist Church with latin inscription saying given on occasion of his conversion to catholicism (which was 1919). Moved to farm in Tepličky where he later retired and is buried, leaving Madunice first to Josef and later to Štefan. Asthmatic. Holidayed in Opatija on the Adriatic. MKS (20) attended his funeral. <p><b>Johanna Schwitzer</b> née Kuffler 1851-1919 Grandmother</p> <p>Johanna was approx 5<sup>th</sup> child of a family of 5 boys and 5 girls (1 younger sister, 4 younger brothers). Marriage to Simon was her second. MKS names one son (Alojz) from previous marriage "who died before 1919", geni.com has a different name Wilhelm Kuffler, confirmed by his death notice published in the NFP on 6.9.1912. From his surname, it's possible Johanna's first marriage was to a Kuffler cousin. Johanna died when MKS was 2, so understandably writes very little about her in Chapter 6, other than that she had a reputation of being bossy and true to family motto "Ja som Kuffler" ("I am a Kuffler"), used to get their own way.</p>		6/33-36 photos 6/34	n/m	d/b
<p><b>Simon Szilard</b> 12.5.1861-30.12.1944 Grandfather</p> <p>One of 8 children, parents were farmers near Nitra (see Chapter 4). Family name originally Schlüssler, hungarianised in keeping with pre-WW1 times. Officer in WW1. Lawyer. Name appears in case histories in Austrian press (search anno.onb.ac.at). MKS points out career was limited by training in hungarian law pre-WW1 but practicing in new country (Czechoslovakia) in which much had changed. House and office in centre of Hlohovec. Loved geraniums. Alice's wartime letters say he became very frail in old age. Died at home in Hlohovec on 30.12.1944, buried secretly in Jewish cemetery. <p><b>Hermína Szilard</b> née Hajós 1866-28.5.1927 Grandmother</p> <p>One of 9 children, with 5 brothers (Lajos, Geza, Emil, Albin, Isidor) and 3 sisters (Paula, Kornelia/Nella, Iren), we have more info about the Hajos family through MKS's contact with Nella Polgar, and the research and online database of Tamas Hajós (Geza's grandson). MKS's memoirs have photos of Hermína as young girl in grounds of the large house in Forró-Encs where she was brought up. Married Simon at 26, had 3 children Alice (MKS's mother), Boris (George Polgar's mother) and son Pista (another daughter died young). Very religious (christian), lived next to church in St Michael's Sq, Hlohovec. MKS remembered her as petite and wearing many rings. <p><b>Štefan Schwitzer</b> 1885-1945 Father Born in Madunice, second child of his father Simon's second marriage, with older half-brother (Josef) and three sisters (Berta, Leona, Frieda). Farmer who was happiest in the fields and stables (see Chapter 7). As farmer, exempted from WW1 military service. By late 1920s was farming over 5000 <i>jutar</i> (more than 7000 acres), making him one of the largest farmers in southern Slovakia (see Chapter 13). MKS describes him (in Chapter 15) as an "adventurous" mixed farmer, growing wheat, barley, clover, lucerne (for silage), broad beans, sugar beat, potatoes, maize, tobacco, gherkins, and even watermelons one season, and with cattle (for beef and their manure), pigs, sheep, 50 pairs of horses for ploughing and other work, oxen, steam &amp; traction engines, and his own distillery (using sugar beet). <p><b>Alice Schwitzer</b> née Szilard ("Licka", "Litzka") 1893-1945 Mother Eldest child of three (a 4<sup>th</sup> died young), brought up in Hlohovec, played piano, enjoyed ballroom dancing and theatre. Married Štefan at 22, divorced when she was 35, requiring a bishop's dispensation (see Chapter 13). Later had a partner, Ernő Weisz, whom she never married (see Appendix A). Lived in Košice from June 1941 (then under military rule), but after Ernő was not allowed to work, moved to rented flat in Budapest living off Ernő's savings. As assimilated churchgoer avoided 1944 hungarian deportations, then moved back to Hlohovec to go into hiding, but caught and deported in December 1944. Went to university in Bratislava to study medicine. Through the British Legation in Bratislava organised a job as student-nurse at London Teaching Hospitals. Started at St Alfeges summer 1939, but on the outbreak of war evacuated to St Mary's Hospital, Sidcup. Returned to St Alfeges as there were no air raids at that time. After Dunkirk was not allowed to work in private hospitals, transferred to a hospital in South London without wounded servicemen, but resigned, supported by Czech government in exile, and later stayed at the Harris's in 18 Gordon St rent-free in return for helping them, and met John. 
