They haven't even bothered to acknowledge the receipt of my letters!! so if you could go along there sometime and ask them whether they have a lawyer there - or if ~~anyone~~ else who could give us legal advice regarding a small matter in Switzerland - I would be very grateful.

 for Patricia as there is going to
 be a competition. It would
 be fun if you could get some

bee - there will be free tea and
I am one of the helpers which
means that we have to pour
out cups of tea and stir in out
buns and whatnots! What a
fiasco - they are expecting
1,000 people.

Let me know when you
can come again - my trip
will suit us.
